GRI promotes and develops this standardized approach to reporting to stimulate demand for sustainability information—which will benefit reporting organizations and those who use report information alike.



ABOUT THE GLOBAL REPORTING INITIATIVE (GRI)

The Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) is a non-governmental organization that develops and disseminates globally Accepted Sustainability Reporting Standards.

The GRI started in 1997 as an initiative of the United Nations Environment Program and became independent in 2002. Headquartered in Amsterdam, the Netherlands, the GRI is an official collaborating center of the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) and works in cooperation with the UN Global Compact.

The GRI develops the sustainability reporting standards guidelines through a multi-stakeholder process that incorporates the active participation of business, accountancy, investment, environmental, human rights, research and labor organizations from around the world.



INVESTMENT

- Participants will receive an internationally recognized certificate directly from the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) after successful completion of the training course.
- This training will provide GRI Standards.
- In addition, participants are eligible to receive a Certified Sustainability Reporting Specialist (CSRS) from Institute of Certified Sustainability Practitioners (ICSP) after successful passing ICSP online examination and submit the assignment.
- CSRS is a professional certification in sustainability reporting and sustainability management, we have around 1,100 graduates since late 2007 in Indonesia, Malaysia and the Philippines.
- Only CSRS graduates are eligible for the Certified Sustainability Reporting Assuror (CSRA) training which objective is to provide assurance on sustainability report and practices based on the AA1000 standards.
